### **Card Game Ideas**


- 1. Stand Up for Idioms Shuffle the cards and place facedown in a pile. Divide players into two teams and both teams stand up. Player One chooses a card, reads it aloud and chooses a standing player from the other team to answer the card. If the other player answers correctly, he/she keeps the card and sits down. If the player answers incorrectly, he/she sits down and chooses a player from the other team to answer the card. Play continues in turn. Team that earns the most cards wins!
- 2. Even or Odd Shuffle the cards and place the deck facedown in a pile. Player One calls "even." Player One chooses a card. If the card number located in the top right corner is "even," Player One reads the card and Player Two guesses the correct answer. If the card number is "odd," Player Two reads the card and Player One guesses the correct answer. Check the answer with the secret decoder. If the player answers the card correctly, he/she keeps the card. Play continues in turn. Player with the most cards wins!
- 3. Hands Up Teacher shuffles the cards and places them facedown in a pile. Teacher chooses a card and reads it aloud. Players raise their hand when they hear the correct answer choice. Talk about the meaning of the idioms, and award one point to the correct responses. Player with the most points wins!
- 4. Less is More Shuffle the cards and divide them evenly between two players. Players place the cards facedown in a pile. Each player flips a card, reads it aloud, and chooses the correct answer. Player who answers correctly keeps both cards. If both players answer correctly, they compare the card number located in the upper right corner of the card. The player with the lowest card number gets to keep both cards. If both players answer incorrectly, both players return the cards to the bottom of their decks. Player with the most cards is Top Dog!
